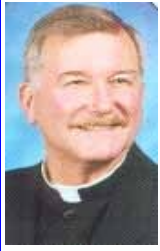

AND NOW A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR...

A quick update on the meetings we've had on the proposed new church for St. Mary.

The meetings with the architects from the firm Studio Red have been very productive. The architects have pushed for a meeting every two weeks to keep the process moving forward. These meetings are developing the design of the church. The consensus has always been that what is wanted is a traditional designed church, somewhat along the lines of the present church but not a duplicate, but a mirror. As of today, the architects, with the input of the design committee, has proposed a church in the cruciform model, that is, a long nave with two arms like a cross with the sanctuary at the head of the nave. The cross arms will allow for future seating as the need arises.

These meeting have been intense and productive. Needless-to-say, all committees have some tension built into the dynamic of the interaction. Hammering out the basic design that will most meet what we envision and will be embraced by generations to come isn't easy. I'm sure that there have been some feelings hurt and some feeling their voice wasn't listened to or not respected. Our object in undertaking such a sensitive project has always been to glorify God and be responsible stewards of the Gospel, preparing the soil for future generations that will take up the yoke of servants after we're all gone.

Keep this in your prayers. Hopefully, in the near future we will have something visual to present for all to see. We're strictly following the process outlined by the Archdiocese. It's a bit tedious but very detailed and helpful to achieve our desired purpose: A structure, more than a building, that will continue to bring us together to a full, active, conscious participation in the Liturgy here on earth as we prepare for the Heavenly Liturgy.

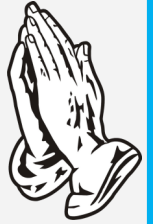

St. Mary's Cemetery Association

We would like to clarify who can be buried in St. Mary's Cemetery. As a private cemetery only actively supporting registered members of St. Mary (minimum of a year) qualify to purchase a plot or niche. For parishioners who meet these guidelines, the current price of a plot or niche is \$1,200. Plots can be stacked burials and niches will hold 2 urns. Non-parishioners who wish to be buried at St. Mary, must have immediate family members who are already buried in the cemetery, or who are active members who have already reserved their plot/niche. The non-parishioner rate is currently \$4,000 for a plot or niche.

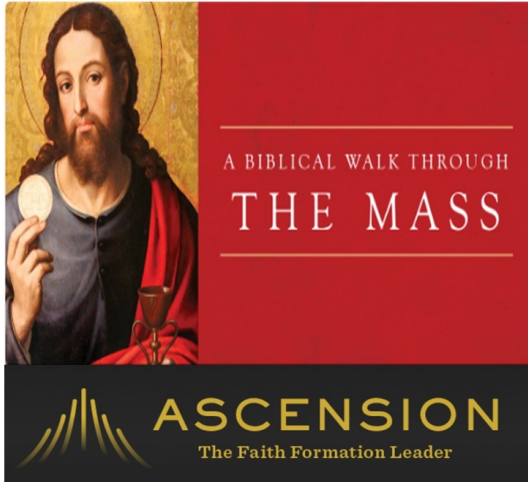

St. Vincent de Paul Vehicle Donations Needs

In the area which we serve, the lack of dependable transportation is one of the major issues of concern we face. Because of this, many of those we serve are significantly limited in their ability to find and keep jobs sufficient to support their families.

As there is no public transportation in our area, our SVDP Conference is embarking on a mission to try to address this issue. Accordingly, we have formed a transportation committee with the task of accepting donated vehicles, no matter their condition, and gifting them to eligible families for work purposes.

Once a vehicle is offered for donation the committee will:

- *Have any mechanical work done to make sure the vehicle is in safe operating condition.
- *Provide the donor with any documentation needed for a tax deduction.
- *After a sufficient vetting process, of the friends we serve as SVDP, we will find an acceptable recipient for the vehicle.

The SVDP Conference will cover all expenses for any repair needed and all of the title and registration expenses and fees.

Several of our parishioners and their friends might be contemplating transitioning to a single vehicle family and thus may seek to dispose of one of their current vehicles. If you or anyone you know is in this position, please ask them to consider supporting SVDP with this transportation issue for those in our area.
