

AND NOW A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR ...

I'm writing this on the eve of yet another Bazaar, the 128th St. Mary's annual homecoming feast. In my 23 years here, each Bazaar has had its obstacles, its roster of hard workers, its humorous incidents, its unforgettable memories and, of course, its bottom line \$. As each year comes-and-goes and time for another Bazaar dawns, it's easy to say "Oh no, another Bazaar." That's how it is when we take for granted what becomes repetitive or commonplace. Sunday of Labor Day weekend: St. Mary's Bazaar; Sunday, Memorial Day weekend, St. Joseph's Bazaar. 'Another Bazaar'.

There's a story about a twenty-two-year-old woman who had been blind since birth. But through the skill of a brilliant surgeon, she was given the gift of sight. When her bandages were removed and she opened her eyes, what she saw was too marvelous. She shut her eyes immediately and refused to open them for two weeks! When she finally had the courage to open them again, she could only repeat over-and-over, "Oh, God, how beautiful, how beautiful."

Our greatest gifts are those which, at this very moment, we are unaware that we possess. Our most precious gifts are so common that we take them for granted until sickness, accident or old age suddenly awakens us to recognize the treasure that we've had but haven't appreciated. It is often only by their absence that we become fully aware of their value and importance in our lives. The litany of such overlooked gifts is a long one: sight, hearing, taste, smell, good health, the use of hands and feet, even the ability to have a good night's sleep. I would add the gift of a parish family planning and working together to put on a holiday feast for others to enjoy, a Bazaar that identifies them as unique among the plethora of parish communities in the area. It's a gift we might not recognize, appreciate or even think of as gift. But it is and we shouldn't forget how important it is in forging us as a family of faith working for the honor and glory of God for others to witness.

The admonition "Don't forget" can be expressed positively by saying, "Be forever grateful". Constant gratitude for common things is uncommon. We take so much for granted. We all know that. We've been given a treasure: a faith family in this out-of-the-way (well, for now) slice of Texas. Our gratitude to the Lord in bringing us together is demonstrated visually when we are seen as His workers in the vineyard He has given us. He delights in the receiver (us) appreciating and enjoying His gift.

I see the Bazaar as a wonderful *Prayer of Thanksgiving* sung with gusto. The paradox is that unless we take time to evaluate and appreciate what is a 'gift' (not just wrapped up presents) we fail to be truly thankful to the Giver of gifts.

Prayer is the great eye opener that holds the magic of making us mystics. A mystic is simply one who experiences God poured forth in every moment. When ending our formal prayer time and when the Bazaar ends at end-of-day, we should open our eyes with the same wonder as that twenty-two-year-old woman. If we do, we will be stunned at what we see, at the marvel of the everyday beauty that surrounds us and the marvel of, yes, another successful Bazaar. Then, the fitting "Amen" to our prayers and the end of Bazaar day would echo the young woman, "Oh, God, how beautiful, how beautiful!"

ON ANOTHER SUBJECT...Knowing the need for rain in our area and in so many areas of the world here is a prayer for rain.

O God.

In You we live and move and have our being.

Please grant us sufficient rain,

So that, being supplied with what sustains us in this present life,

We may seek more confidently what sustains us for eternity.

We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son,

Who lives and reigns with You in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Amen...I am forever grateful, O God. How beautiful, how beautiful, You are!





- Learning Target 2.2.12 The Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist together constitute the Sacraments of Christian Initiation, whose unity must be safeguarded. The Sacrament of Confirmation is necessary for the completion of baptismal grace.
 [Catechism of the Catholic Church #1285]
- ◆ Learning Target 2.2.22 Confirmation perfects baptismal grace; it is the sacrament in which the Holy Spirit roots one more deeply in divine filiation, incorporates one more firmly into Christ, strengthens one's bond with the Church, associates one more closely with her mission, and helps one bear witness to the Christian faith in words, accompanied by deeds.

WHAT are my responsibilities and expectations for these preparation sessions?

- Submit an updated baptismal certificate
- ◆ Select a sponsor who is a "fully initiated Catholic" as prescribed by Canon Law
- Attend the October 8 Retreat at the home of Sharon Skeans
- Prepare for and participate in SIX 2-hour sessions with team catechists
- ◆ Continue to attend weekly Mass & increase your daily prayer life
- Celebrate the "joy" of the fruits and gifts of the Holy Spirit at a regional site presided by the bishop

If you are interested in celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation in January 2023, preparation sessions begin on October 8, 2022, and will conclude by Christmas.
