

AND NOW A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR ...

It's hard to believe that we're coming to that time of the year when one of our church's bazaar is over and we're at the threshold of the other church's bazaar. Bazaars are a lot of work. I'm sure I hear an 'Amen' echoing out there. I think every pastor has heard a parishioner or parishioners plead, 'Father, just ask each parishioner/family to give X amount and we'll all save a lot of time and work'. The important factor to remember is that the parish bazaar is not just about making

money, but has a tsunami impact on the parish as a community of faith.

I can almost predict that the first historical bazaar's purpose *was* to make money. Someone came up with the idea to have food and games for parishioners and the general community to come support a necessary project. Wanna bet that that first church was Catholic?....lol. Both of our communities of St. Mary and St. Joseph probably held their first bazaar shortly after the church building went up, both were initially called Homecomings' because it was an opportunity for families to come together and visit. There are few records of those early homecomings/ bazaars but what we have indicates that they were enjoyed and well attended by parishioners, probably few outsiders. The funds were not considerable but had to be much appreciated by the pastor in meeting the expenses of the church. As churches grew in the number of parishioners and newcomers settling in the area, the homecoming/bazaar gradually took on more of a bazaar activity with an element of a homecoming for some of the original families whose members moved from the area and 'were coming home'. More and more the bazaar was opened up to the community-at-large ...where the money was ... lol.

The parish bazaar has become THE vehicle which unites the entire parish in a common effort. Of course, our primary focus is to be a Eucharistic Community united first in our worship together. Yet, we bring that unity at Table in church into every activity of the parish. We are blessed that we have so many opportunities to come together and to be of service to othersAltar Society, Men's Club, Vincent de Paul, CCE, RCIA, Sunday Hospitality, Gabriel Project, Bible Study, Senior Group (Guardian Angels) ...etc... AND the Annual Parish Bazaar. The Bazaar brings every ministry and every organization together. It is the one time of the year when we open our doors to the community-at-large and shine as a united Faith Community welcoming and working together. I can't tell you how many times during the bazaar I hear, "Father, you have a wonderful parish here! How do you do it? How do you get so many volunteers to work together on a day like this?" My response is "They're not volunteers, they're disciples of Jesus. They're doing what He told us to do: Welcome the stranger. Be His light in our world today". I have to say that we do that very well from the initial planning to the clean-up when it's over.


For me the most important aspect of the bazaar experience is that it mixes up people. Honestly, we are all people of habit and feel most comfortable with people we are used to. Case in point: ya'll all sit on the same side, in the same place in church for the weekend Masses [even the daily Masses ...] unless someone has 'taken' your place, getting there before you. Then, you take a seat nearby. I'm confused when I see some of you on the 'wrong' side or closer to the front...lol. The 5pm people see the 5pm people....etc. Even at fellowship in the hall after the Sunday Masses, it's just natural to sit and visit with those whom we know, BUT putting on a bazaar requires that everyone row in the same direction and row together. It's the only time of the year that the entire parish rolls up its sleeves and rubs shoulders with those who one might recognize but have never formally met. Parishioners who see each other in Walmart but didn't realize they went to the same church now have something special in common. New comers meet the old timers, old timers share stories and answer questions that new comers have. That's why you hear me hounding everyone to be involved in some aspect of the bazaar. It's the perfect opportunity to get connected with your fellow parishioners and really get rooted in the parish. Visitors always remark on how we seem to enjoy each other's company and have a good time together. I tell them how proud I am of all of you and how blessed we are to have such a wonderful Faith family.

We had a very successful St. Joseph's bazaar and are now getting ready for St. Mary's. Our two communities are fortunate that we're bound together not only by our common Roman Catholic Faith but by the bonds of association and friendship formed through the years. Our bazaars are known throughout the Archdiocese as the ones to imitate and attend. That's quite a reputation to live up to.



JOIN THE STITCHIN' SISTERS


Are you interested in bringing back a lost art? Are you interested in having a good time with a great group of ladies?


