

### AND NOW A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR ...

It's hard to believe that we're into one full month of the new year: 2021. Still we find ourselves evicted from the church and buildings we hold so dear. I keep asking myself and am being asked: How long will we be out under the pavilion? As I've written before, so much depends on the instruction from our Cardinal. Like us all, he is awaiting a lifting of the 6 foot distancing guideline from both the national and state officials. The bright side to this craziness is that we are entering a warming

trend. Hope it lasts.

With Lent beginning February 17th, we can count on being out under the pavilions for the duration. I guess we can all 'offer it up'. This year Ash Wednesday Masses and the Distribution of Ashes will all be celebrated at St. Mary. It just seems common sense to concentrate the Masses to one place rather than set up for only one Mass at St. Joseph, a Mass that has to be really simply celebrated due to the time constraint to get people back to work. The schedule of Masses and Distribution of Ashes is elsewhere in this bulletin but to reinforce and remind everyone, here it is again: 9am at St. Mary...12:15 at St. Mary...6pm at St. Mary.

With the distribution of the COVID vaccine underway, I am hopeful that we will begin to be comfortable in confined spaces again. I am hearing that more and more of us are receiving the shot. We are all being told it will be a while till we can all relax and maybe even shake hands again....

Our Easter Celebration have been outdoors at St. Mary for many yeas now and will continue this year also. God knows we have had a lot of practice staging under the pavilion and won't require the amount of work putting it together as it took in past years. Hopefully the Easter crowds will be what they have been in years past. For newcomers, the Easter Masses at St. Mary under the pavilion would draw numbers raging from 600 to almost 1,000. We'll be ready once again to make the greatest feast of the liturgical year something to remember. The Easter celebration at St. Joseph will be under the pavilion for the first time. As at St. Mary during this unique period, practice makes perfect.

We will pray the Stations of the Cross in church on Fridays during Lent. Should the crowds prove too large, we may have to reinvent the stations outside..... Please note that both our churches are open 24/7 with the lights and ac/ heating on. You may want to take advantage of the opportunity to pray your Lenten devotions in a private, personal setting. Station of the Cross booklets and other prayer material will be provided on the table as you enter. Just please return so others might benefit also. Confessions are heard on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of the month from 10-12noon & 5-6pm. I am using Fr. Kelly's confessional because it offers more space between priest and penitent.

I sometimes feel that we have all been in a prolonged Season of Penitence. We've been carrying the burden of isolation and distancing, fear and uncertainty. We've held up well. I think we all give the credit to our Faith that roots us in trusting that Christ is in our midst through it all. Like many families, we, as a Church Family, have learned to appreciate one another more and have drawn close together. We have come to hunger for the time when we will again be inside the churches we call 'home'. Let's face it: This has to be a better Easter than last Easter 2020. At least we won't be celebrating Easter virtually!

# The Shofar Is Heard Loud And Clear During Lent and Easter!

The shofar (i.e., "ram's horn") will be heard at the beginning of our Sunday celebrations during the Lenten and Easter Season. During the Lenten Season, the simple ram's horn is used with three short wail-like blasts (signifying repentance). During the Easter Season, an ornately decorated ram's horn is used with a long single blast (the sound of the King's coronation).

It is important to realize that the shofar was used and will be used in our celebrations as a means of awakening the slumbering soul. Maimonides, a renowned Jewish scholar, writes: "There is a hidden message we are supposed to infer by listening to the shofar. It suggests to say: 'Sleeping ones! Awaken from your sleep! Slumbering ones! Awaken from your slumber! Examine your deeds. Remember your Creator and repent!" This idea was earlier stated in the New Testament writings: "Awake, O sleeper, and arise from the dead, and Messiah will shine on you" (Eph. 5:13-14). This theme of 'awakening from sleep' is used elsewhere in the Scriptures (e.g., John 11:11, Rom. 13:11, 1 Thess. 5:6, Dan. 12:1-2, Psalm 78:65). The sound of the shofar calls us to return to the Lord and seek His face. And since finding God is our greatest joy, King David rightly wrote, "Happy is the people who know the shofar blast" (Psalm 89:16). Indeed, the word shofar comes from a Jewish root that means to beautify, alluding to the beautification of our ways as we turn to God in Lenten repentance and, with Easter joy, raise our voices in jubilation!

We are very fortunate to have Larry Langston as our almost professional shofar sounder. Larry takes seriously his ministry as sounder of the shofar to begin our Lenten and Easter liturgies. He has done all the research as to how to sound the shofar distinctly for each season. He practices diligently so as to give us the authentic rendition of the shofar's sound. I don't think that any other parishes have this special ritual beginning of their Lenten or Easter celebrations. As in so many ways, we are blessed communities.

When Lent begins, the two shofars will be installed on the wall nearest to the Blessed Mother's altar at St. Mary. They will have their permanent place there for all to see. Feel free to come up close and admire the beauty of these two instruments that have such a profound and sacred history.




\*\* Be a resource to answer questions about pregnancy, child care, and parenting
