

AND NOW A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR ...



I would like to 'ditto' Bill Jones' article [found in this month's bulletin) on the importance of volunteers in every society, every nation and particularly in the Church. In fact, Christ's call to the disciples was a call to 'volunteer' and be His co-workers in spreading the Good News. From the earliest Church, disciples responded to the Gospel call to come forward and be His light in the world. In doing so, those disciples became a family devoted to the Lord and to each other. Others

looking in remarked, "See how they love one another". That statement can also be translated, "See how they pray together, live together and work together. I want what they have!". That activity so freely entered into and enjoyed was the hallmark of the Early Church. I sincerely believe that spirit of volunteering, coming forward and working shoulder-to-shoulder is still our hallmark as a Universal Church and, especially evident and operating here in our parish communities of St. Mary and St. Joseph.

Bill outlines the many benefits of volunteering to the individual and to the community or cause. He puts forth very well the value and the rewards of volunteering. Without volunteers, so much of what needs to be done in the world, our nation, civic community and parish would be left undone. To put it another way...We'd all be up a creek! As pastor...and I think I can speak not only for myself but for all priests...there is another very valuable factor in volunteering in the parish that might not, at first, be evident. A pastor has a difficult time meeting and interacting with his flock. The handshake after Mass is sincerely an expression of each other's gratitude for being together at Mass. I find my purpose and energy celebrating the Eucharist with you and having those moments of saying 'Hello' personally after Mass and, sometimes even having a short conversation about something going on in your life. Unless we have an occasion such as a wedding or funeral, our getting acquainted is limited. I'm always open to coming to your home, relaxing and enjoying a good meal [I don't cook] but there are only so many days/weeks/months and quite a few of ya'll. Not to mention the other demands on my time.

I can honestly say that I look forward to the times when an event or project comes up and I can rub shoulders with you and, in doing so, get to know you on another level. Yes, I know I'll always be pastor and you parishioner but, in that interaction, we also become more...I put names to faces...wives with husbands...children with parents...even grandparents with grandchildren and, as time goes on, ...friends. I look forward to those occasions. I also think that for children to see their parents involved in church activities roots them in the Church. Church becomes more than just a Sunday-going-to-church and becomes truly a faith home where Jesus' family works together. Volunteering also impresses on the youth that it's praying and *working* together that truly makes us disciples. I think it's also a great opportunity for kids to see the priest/pastor off the altar and not in all those robes! ... lol. I recognize and sympathize with the many extracurricular activities that kids have these days and how you parents and grandparents are stretched to the limit at times. However, as busy as my parents were working to keep body and soul together, we kids knew what was important by how they managed their time and our time: church was definitely important. When I was scheduled for 5:30am Mass for a week...Mon-Sat...I was there...sometimes kicking and unhappy...but there. It was important and I volunteered to be a server.

I also realize a lot of us are getting up there in age and may not be moving as sprightly as we used to. As I would tell my mom [who died at 95), no one retires in serving the Lord. There's always something we can do...or something that will be found we can do. It's remarkable the sense of accomplishment that is felt when done, not to mention what getting out of the house and a little exercise can do.

We have so many opportunities to volunteer and be servants of the Lord in prayer and in the work we do in His name. As I'm writing this, I'm thinking of the upcoming Rummage Sale on November 5th. It takes a lot of volunteers to pull off...setting it up...working the day...helping the shoppers...and at the same time, getting to meet other parishioners and know the ones you see and know .. to know 'em better. I am also inspired this moment to extend an invitation to those at St. Joseph who might hear Christ calling to come over and volunteer at St. Mary's Rummage Sale. Yes, it's St. Mary's Rummage Sale but what a wonderful way to witness to our oneness in Christ and a great way to get to know members of each other's communities.

Well, you've had a lot in this bulletin about how important it is that you see yourself as a disciple of Christ, a volunteer in His service and about how important it is to our parish family that each of us works together in the many ministries and activities that lie before us and need us. A lot to think about.

2022 Mission Appeal Sister Catherine Theodore Uboh, HHCJ The Congregation of the Handmaids of the Holy Child Jesus

The group assigned to our Parish this year 2022 Mission Appeal is, the Congregation of the Handmaids of the Holy Child Jesus. Sister Catherine Theodore Uboh, HHCJ will be speaking to us from the Congregation of the Handmaids of the Holy Child Jesus on the weekend of November 12/13, 2022.

The Congregation of the Handmaids of the Holy Child Jesus is a Religious Congregation founded in Nigeria in 1931 by a Religious Sister of Charity, Mother Mary Charles Magdalen Walker, RSC, *Servant of God*, in response to many needs of Africa. Today, they have over 900 professed Sisters, ministering in seven countries of Africa - (Nigeria, Ghana, Kenya, Cameroon, Sierra Leone, Togo and Tanzania); three countries in Europe (England, Germany and Italy); North America (the United States of America, and Canada) and in Grenada in West Indies.

Their mission focusses this year on Nigeria, Sierra Leone and Cameroon mission where starvation, socio-political wars etc. are going on - to provide rehabilitation, care for the vulnerable people and education for over 205 students with low vision, partial vision and total blindness. They also need funds to:1) provide fresh water; 2) buy educational materials like print textbooks and instructional materials, Braille machines, Audio materials etc. and 3) For feeding and clothing of the most vulnerable part of the body of Christ. They need our prayers and financial assistance to continue this mission.

Your support to this worthy cause will be an immense encouragement to the Congregation of the Handmaids of the Holy Child Jesus as they continue to serve God in humanity. Thank you for your support and God bless you.



Patriotic Rosary




