AND NOW A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR ...



Recently I was asked the question: "Why does the priest (or deacon) pour a small amount of water into the chalice following his putting in the wine." A good question. It sparked my thinking of the other actions during the Liturgy that might seem rather odd or cause one to wonder 'what's that all about'? Like so much in life that is important, the more we understand what's going on, the more we can appreciate and

enter into what's happening. Our Mass, our Liturgy, has quite a number of actions that, without explanation, can seem mysterious or just be taken for granted or overlooked. Let's start with:

The Entrance Procession of ministers: cross, acolytes (servers), lector, deacon, presider (priest). This procession is not just a means of getting the ministers to the front of the church and to their places but has a deep theological significance, reminding us all of the fact that the entire people of God are pilgrims-we are a pilgrim people on the road from here (the earth) to eternity (to heaven). It is important that this procession reflect and be seen as our pilgrimage ultimately to Christ. At a National Pastoral Musicians Conference years ago, we were cautioned that, if the procession was seen as a 'getting the priest to the altar', musicians might be careful in choosing the Gathering Hymn. "Hail, Holy Queen!" might not be too appropriate. This procession of ministers on pilgrimage is completed when each takes his place within the Assembly. The priest who presides and leads the Assembly takes his place at the presider's chair. Now that all are gathered and in place is the Gathering Hymn sung. (It might be observed that many parishes still utilize the Gathering Hymn as a means of 'getting the priest to the altar'.) One liturgist at a conference commented that no one wants to miss a parade and getting stuck singing a hymn does just that ... lol.

Before the presider (priest) gets to his chair, he does something that might look a bit strange: he venerates (kisses) the altar. What's that all about?

The kiss is intended first of all simply for the altar, the Lord's table. But eventually the meaning of the kiss was enlarged by the idea that the altar (usually built of stone) represented Christ Himself, the cornerstone, our spiritual rock. Thus, the kiss began to represent kissing Christ Himself. With the growth of the veneration of martyrs (the first saints), it gradually became a rule from the beginning of the Middle Ages on, that every church (not just the cathedral church) should have their martyr's grave, and finally that every altar must enclose a 'sepulcher' or little reliquary. Thus, the kissing of the altar is transformed into the kissing of the martyr and, through him, of all the saints. If you were to fold back the altar cloth, you'd find a stone imbedded in the altar. It's called the Altar Stone. Usually there are 5 crosses etched in the stone, representing the 5 wounds of Christ. You'll also find a small circle of stone, sealed. Sealed under this stone circle is the relic of a saint (now not necessarily a martyr). Unfortunately no record is available as to which saint is in the Altar Stone of our churches. Probably this is the case for most churches. You'd think that might be an important piece of information, but evidently not. We've asked the Archdiocese. No record.

I'm going to continue this exploration of other actions within the Mass in next month's bulletin. Hopefully, after reading this, these two liturgical actions will make more sense and give more meaning in our celebration of the Eucharist. Also, am wanting to keep you in suspense until next monthlol. Some years ago, I spent an afternoon caught up in a piece of sewing I was doing. The wastebasket near my sewing machine was filled with scraps of fabric cut away from my project. This basket of discards was a fascination to my daughter who, at the time was three years old. She rooted through the scraps searching out the long bright scraps of cloth, collected them and went off. I found her sitting in the grass with a long pole she had gotten from the garage. She was fixing the scraps to the top of the pole. I asked her what she was doing. She answered, "I'm making a banner for a procession. I need a procession so that God will come down and dance with us." With that, she lifted her banner to the wind, and slowly got up to dance.






