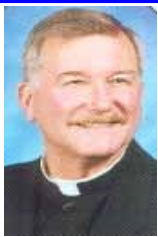

## AND NOW A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR ...

I want to apologize to our Confirmation Class for being absent at the Confirmation on October 14<sup>th</sup>. Of all the years to be absent, it would be the year Cardinal DiNardo was the celebrant! I've heard through the grapevine that the Cardinal was pointedly and amusingly referencing my absence in his homily and visit.

So, where did I go and what was so important as to be absent at the Confirmation of probably one of the largest classes we have had in a long time? And absent when the celebrant was the Cardinal?

It all started with the visit of Fr. Peter Vasko to our parish earlier in May or June. Fr. Peter is a Franciscan friar/priest who has been our guide on all our pilgrimages to the Holy Land. In fact, I have made it known to the company that arranges the travel and accommodations that we don't go without Fr. Peter as our guide. He is the Franciscan who guides all dignitaries of State and celebrities who visit the Holy Land. He became special friends with President Trump on his visit, both being New Yorkers! I particularly want a Franciscan guide because the Franciscans have an 800 year history of being in the Holy Land and caring for the holy sites. When all the other religious orders were expelled from the Holy Land by the Moslems, only the Franciscans were allowed to stay because the Moslem leader had met and was impressed with St. Francis of Assisi. The Franciscans have special access to many of the sites and Fr. Peter is well versed in the history and significance of each one.

Fr. Peter is also head of the Franciscan Foundation of the Holy Land that provides scholarships for native Palestinian students to study and receive a good education and enter a profession that enables them to stay in the Holy Land and not immigrate to other countries. The Christian presence in Israel has been declining for decades. The Foundation has been determined and active to reverse this trend.

During Fr. Peter's visit here, he invited me to attend a special fundraiser for the Foundation that would be held in Washington, DC. It's held every two years and is the Foundation's acknowledgement and appreciation of those who have especially been supportive. Those invited also donate significantly for the privilege to attend and be appreciated...lol. I was invited to be Fr. Peter's special guest and, I figured out later, to have our parish acknowledged as a supporter of the Foundation's work by our sponsoring of students through the years.

The date of the Foundation's Gala was October 14<sup>th</sup>, the same day of our Confirmation. I didn't realize it at the time I accepted Fr. Peter's invitation and, when I did, I was on the guest list and arrangements were made for my being there. To be totally honest, I was very flattered to have been invited and curious to experience such an event. Knowing how special it was and where it was being hosted, I actually went out and bought a new suit! (I had no idea how expensive clothing is these days...I usually shop our rummage). I decided to splurge because I figured this was my last suit. The suit in my closet is probably 20+ years old and definitely out of style. I am indebted to Margy Manning for repairing my clerical collar on such short notice. It's been a while since I wore so much clerical black.

I arrived several days prior to the event and was escorted by Fr. Peter himself to the Franciscan Monastery of the Holy Land, Washington DC. (I encourage you to google it and look at their website), It was founded in 1899 and is awesome. It covers a large wooded area in DC. I was warmly welcomed by the friars and given a room in what I would call the guest section of the monastery. It's a bit separate from the friars' quarters, only by a short hallway. I was rooming next to the Bishop of Venice, Florida. Next to him was the Bishop of Springfield, Illinois! High Cotton! The room was very nice with an adjoining bath. The entire monastery is air-conditioned and heated, though with the high ceilings I was very comfortable without the a/c. I was free to roam around and explore as I pleased. The peacefulness of the monastery and the beauty of the antique religious art throughout was an experience in itself. I ate my meals with the friars in their common dining room, the refectory. (Brought back seminary days .. lol). The food was very good and ample, prepared by a hired service because the friars are so busy elsewhere in the monastery. I even ate three meals a day! Rare for me. I took a lot of pics. Will share.

## AND NOW A WORD FROM YOUR PASTOR (contin.) ...

The Gala was held in the residence of the Apostolic Nuncio, the Pope's ambassador to the United States. His residence is across the street from the Vice President's house. Unlike the Vice President's house which is completely barricaded and guarded, the Nuncio's house has only an electronic gate. It's a very impressive, classical house in which are his offices as well. He lives there with, I think, 3 priests who are his assistants in the embassy. It's elegant in its furnishings. There are portraits of all the past Nuncios which is an impressive gallery. The chapel is small but beautiful and has displayed a rock from the foundation of the Holy Sepulcher. I got there early with Fr. Peter and wandered around taking pictures ... (: I asked a waiter to prep me on what all the items were on the table. I've never seen so many glasses and flatware. I didn't want to make a mistake. I was wearing my new suit.

There were only 60 guests. Fr. Peter, the Comptroller and the Guardian of the Monastery were the Franciscans present. Of course, the Apostolic Nuncio greeted us and we all took a picture with him. He's French and was very personable. Unfortunately, the Patriarch of Jerusalem and the Custos of the Holy Land were unable to attend because of the recent upheaval in Israel and Gaza. (The Patriarch of Jerusalem offered himself in exchange for the hostages held by Hamas). I met many interesting and friendly guests at the event. Texas was well represented. I sat at Fr. Peter's table with a couple from Dallas and a couple from Shreveport. I think I used all the utensils correctly and was relieved I didn't turn over any of the glasses lined up before me. Our parish was noted as a supporter of the Foundation's work by sponsoring students. It was a great evening, unforgettable in many ways. Even the food was tasty!

Sunday morning, I concelebrated with about 15 friars, with the Bishop of Springville presiding. The liturgy was beautiful and the church full with people who, I guess, live in DC or know the Mass is open to the public. Of course, with the crisis occurring in Israel and Gaza, the Franciscans were particularly in prayer for their cohorts spread across the Holy Land.

I failed to mention that the Monastery contains a basilica, a huge church that overwhelms you. If you ever get to DC, be sure to register for the tour of this basilica. It's a special hidden jewel among all the other attractions of DC. It contains replicas of many of the holy places in Jerusalem. I was especially impressed with the replica of the Holy Sepulcher, without the altar built over it. Bethlehem, Nazareth and even the catacombs of Rome are replicated, with the tombs of St. Cecilia and St. Sebastian. Too much to explain here. Either plan a visit or google the website.

I completely enjoyed my stay and visit with Fr. Peter and his brother Franciscans. I didn't know what to expect and was overwhelmed with their hospitality and friendliness. Fr. Peter is now visiting his relatives in New York. The big question is when will he be able to return to Israel. The discussion was that, even if it were possible to return, Jerusalem and most of Israel is in lockdown. Might as well stay here. Fr. Peter knows our door is always open. (He brags about the 5 star guest room in our rectory!)

Let us all keep him and his fellow friars in prayer. I pledged, knowing your generosity, that we'd continue to support the work of the Foundation. We've been asked to help provide for a Christmas party for the US Marines stationed in Jerusalem. Fr. Peter is their chaplain and tries to take good care of them. I told him, "No Problem".

Again, I apologize to our Confirmandi. I might not have been there in person but thought of ya'll that morning and had ya'll in prayer. I mentioned to the Nuncio that I was probably in the dog house with Cardinal DiNardo and if he'd put in a good word for me. He smiled and nodded ... lol.

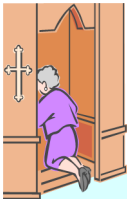

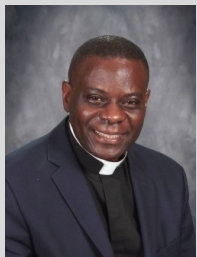

### **November is All Souls Month!**

As we near the end of the Liturgical Year, we encounter challenges to be more like Christ, in our actions even more than in our words.

I admit, I'm not good at this. I fear breaking things when trying to build, making situations worse when trying to make them better, and not being "qualified" to offer solutions to advice seekers. I'm a quiet contemplative (some may say neurotic), more of a "be-er" than a "do-er", more of a listener than a proclaimer.

I do know liturgical principles. Fr. Ed has been adamant with me, and others, about creating a congregation of "FULL, CONSCIOUS, AND ACTIVE" participants. I have always strived to use that same mantra in my own preparations for church gatherings. It is a command from liturgical documents, and I do not take them lightly.

Our congregation typically does wonderful liturgy (the "work of the people"). I would like to challenge us to do a bit better when consoling a congregant seeking solace at the death of a loved one. To that end, I'd appreciate a call from several/many of you being willing to support families of deceased members by using your voices to support the singing at funerals. This "Resurrection" Choir would not need to sit in the loft, therefore climbing the stairs cannot be an excuse! Rather, I envision a few congregants sitting several pews behind the loved ones of the deceased, supporting them by praying in song.

The repertoire will not be grand; the rehearsal requirements will be minimal. The willingness and ability to attend and participate in funeral Masses and celebrations, never scheduled very far in advance, is crucial, along with a servant's consoling, and SINGING, heart. Basically, being behind the grieving family, we will be singing—"we've got your back"!

Once up and running, after one or two introductory meetings/rehearsals, my plan to implement such a choir is to get your emails (preferred) or phone numbers (when you do not have an e-mail address), and I would simply inform you of each upcoming funeral. You would respond back whether you are able to help this time, given the short notice typical of funeral Masses. Retirees - I'm calling for your help especially!

Of course, all groups like this start in someone's imaginations/dreams, and end up having a life of their own, evolving into what (with prayer and God's guidance) they are meant to be.

Are you able and willing to help? If so, please let me know by email (preferably) or phone call to the office. I hope to meet with Resurrection for the first time in the middle of November to discuss further.

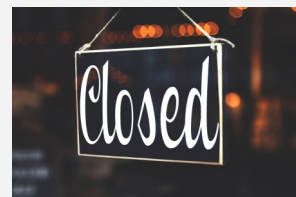

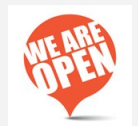
